Baybrook Violence Reduction Plan (BVRP)

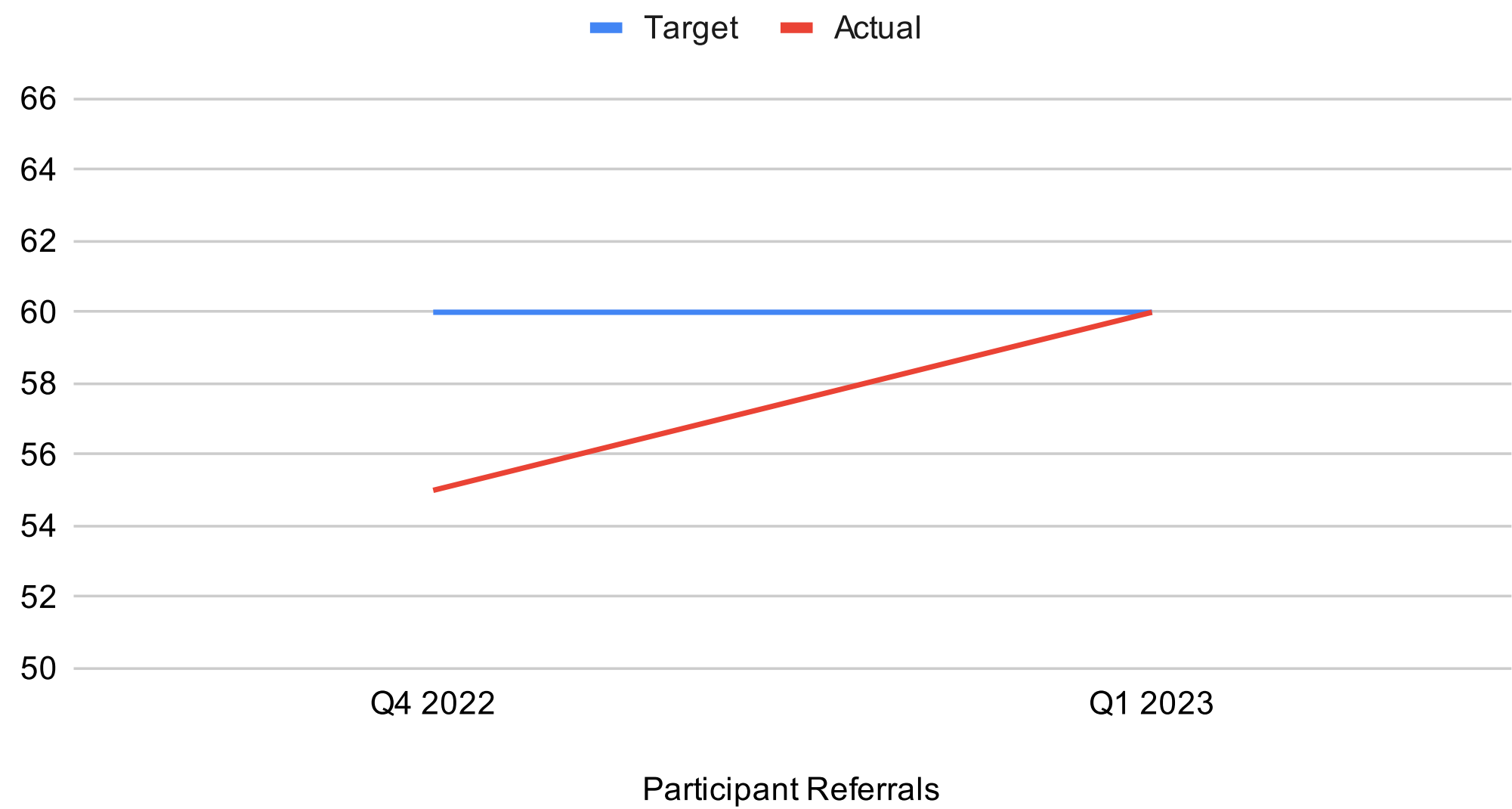
6-month Performance Report

The Baybrook Violence Reduction Plan (BVRP) is a community-led public safety strategy to reduce violence and increase the quality of life in the Brooklyn, Brooklyn Park, and Curtis Bay neighborhoods. The BVRP consists of three primary components: (1) Youth Violence Prevention; (2) Youth Engagement; and (3) Community Projects/Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design. The following is a report on the progress of the BVRP after 6 months of implementation.

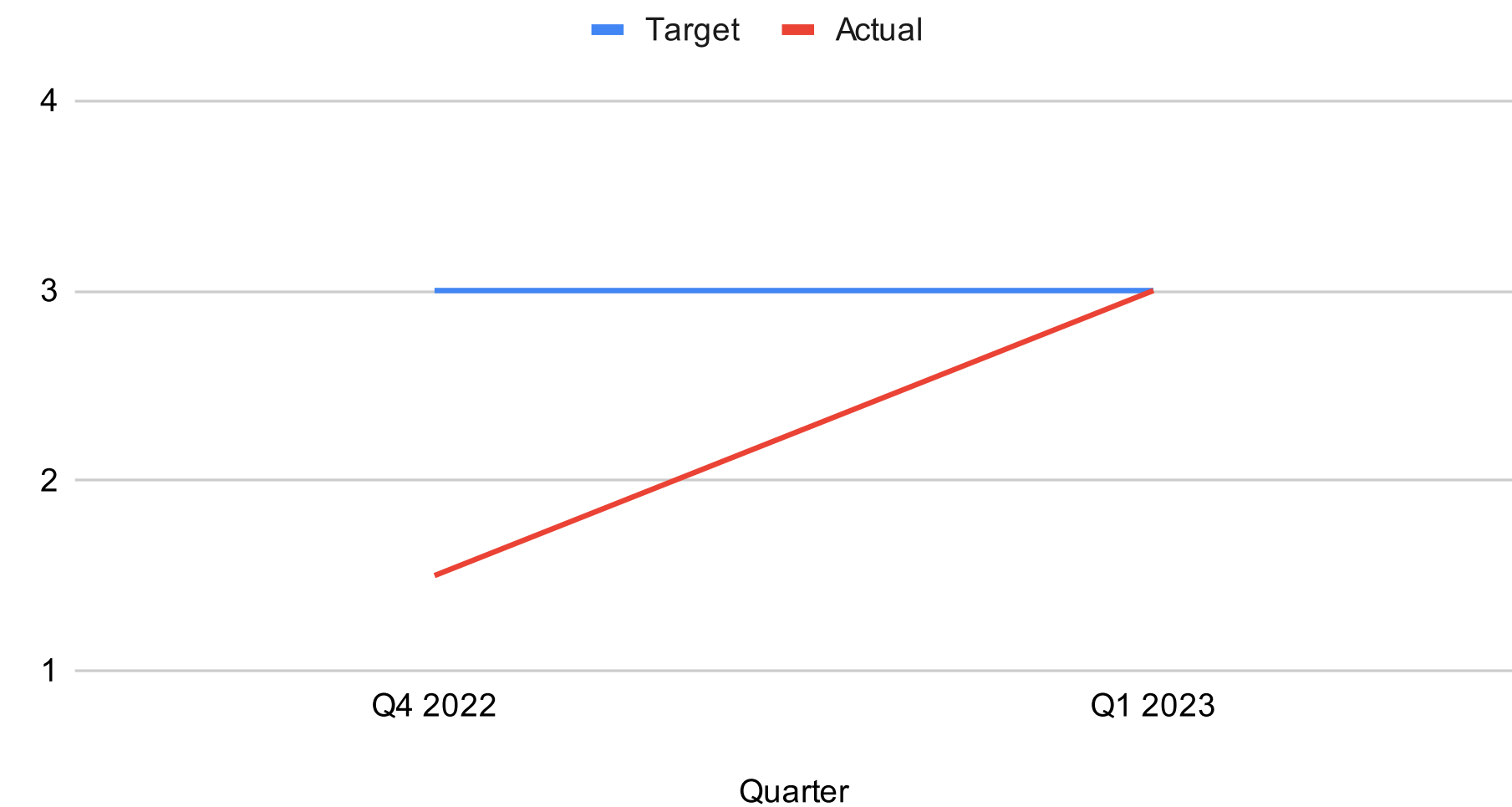
CLB Participant Referrals

CLB Average Contacts with Life Coach



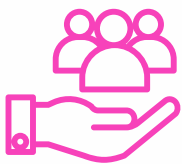
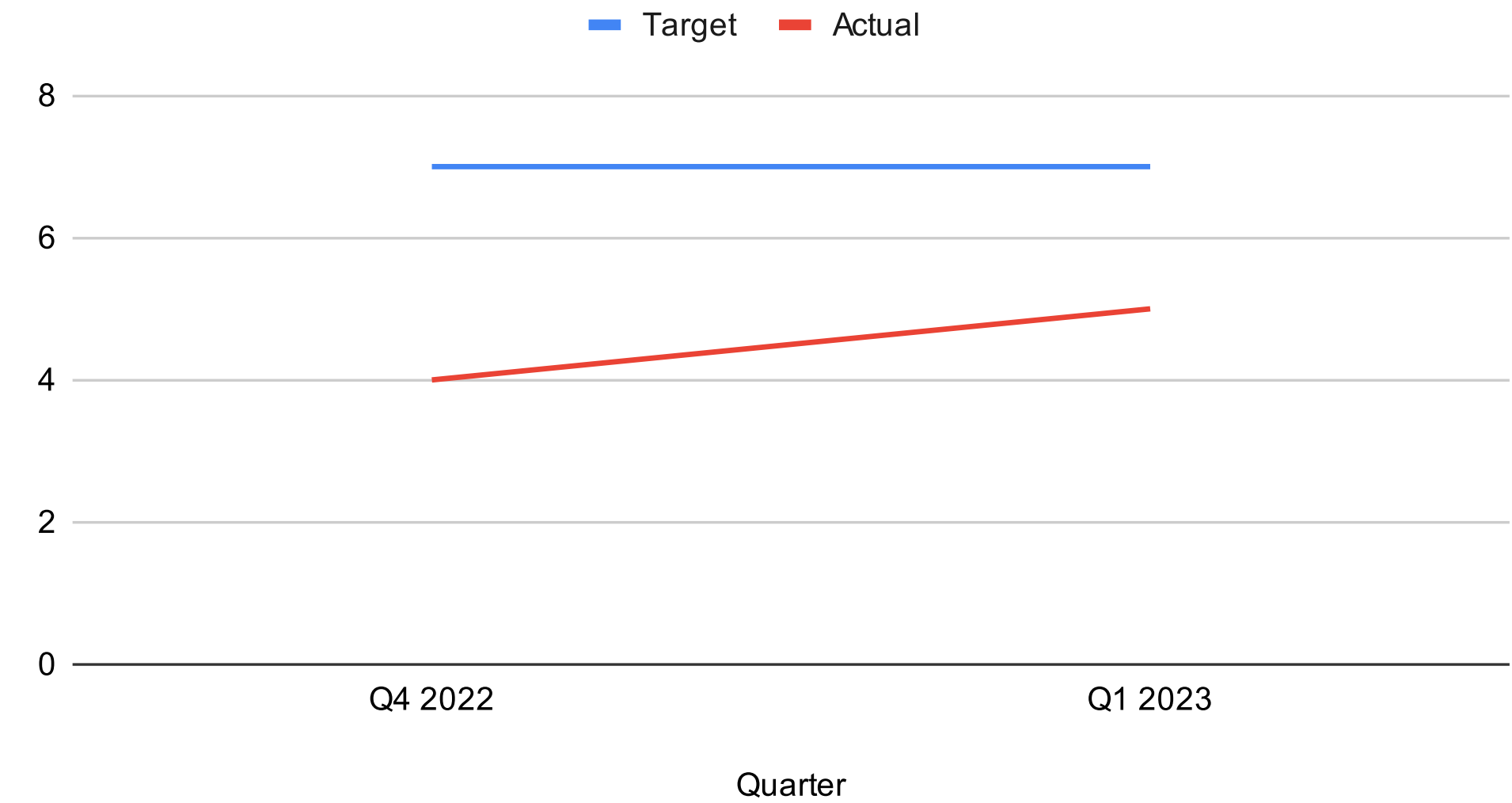
Next Steps

Youth Leaders Identified and Recruited



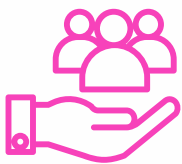
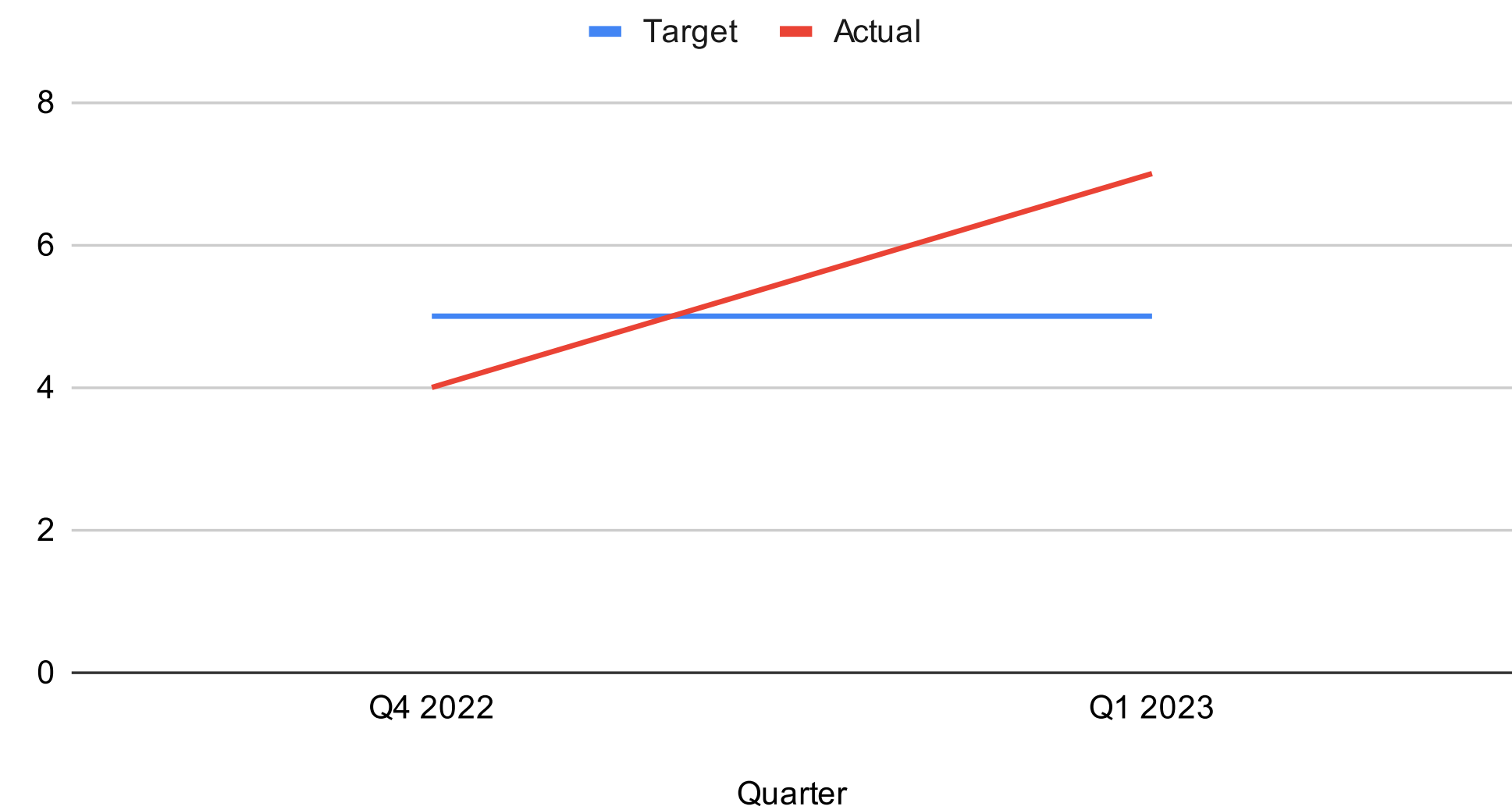

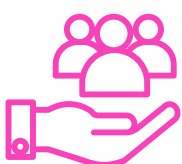
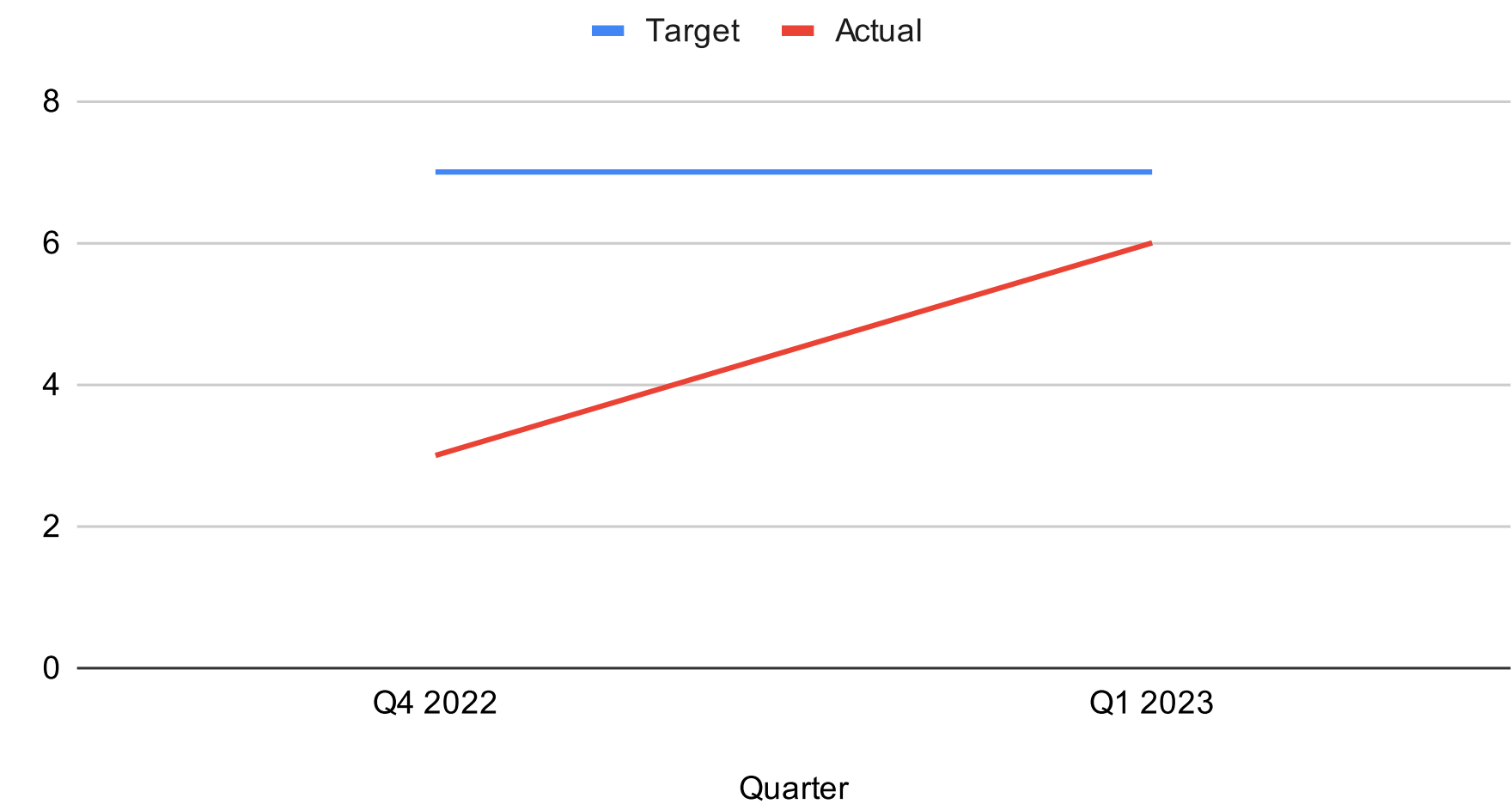
\$1.4 million of investment

Active CPTED Projects

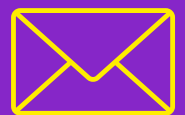


\$1.4 million of investment
