



5:00 - Air quality monitoring and enforcement - Angelo Bianca/MDE

Dec 30 explosion at coal towers damaged towers and conveyers.

Company asked MDE to allow them to bring in temporary conveyors.

MDE is reviewing plan to determine whether it could be permitted and if so, what would be needed to control emissions to permitted levels.

Also bringing in water to keep dust down.

Jan 12 – MDE approved just for 10 days in order to clear area so repairs could be made.

Required use of Tier 4 engines – cleanest diesels available

Has taken longer than expected, so extension of 10-day limit was requested.

MDE then approved 20 days, or 360 operating days, whatever comes first. On Jan 24.

MDE looking to add additional monitoring to next permit.

Department is submitting grant to EPA to put sensors in Curtis Bay and other communities.

As part of enhanced compliance oversight effort in this area, MDE is considering asking companies in the area to meet periodically.

Q: What was cause of the explosion? Investigation underway.

Q: Any resources for foundation inspections of residents? CSX has toll-free number residents can call with concerns. Angelo did not know what agency has oversight of that. Community wants CSX to be held accountable. CSX Public Safety Coordination Center - 800-232-0144

Q: Need monitors to determine what residents are being exposed to. People have been impacted health-wise. CSX should be required to take measurements and report to the communities. MDE should required to do this. Angelo asked for clarification of what community wants, was taking notes.

Phylicia Porter – (46th district) says the situation is unacceptable and will ask for meeting with MDE and CSX. Angelo will ask CSX regarding meeting.

Q: Does the data they collect go to MDE? Can it be obtained through FOIA? Yes, MDE will share all public information.

Q: Is it shut down? Only the North terminal is closed. South side is still in operation.

Angelo asked to be invited to the Steering Committee meetings going forward to stay in contact with the GBA and community. Meredith said he would be added to the distribution list.
